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

President's report: It's hard to believe another year has passed. What a year!!!

The success of BVAC is the willingness of member groups to get involved in activities and support one another during this process. The group representatives who attend the monthly BVAC meetings are much valued and the role they play at those meetings ensures our activities and goals continue to be achieved.

As the exiting President, I must admit to having a huge dose of imposter syndrome, as it is really the executive team of secretary and treasurer who have carried the weight this year. Anna-Margot and Joanna have been invaluable, and I cannot thank them enough for their dedication and perseverance. Special thanks must also go to Perrin for doing a sterling job as our property manager, considering she also had many hurdles to cross throughout the year. Member groups should be rightly proud of their representatives on committee who attend meetings regularly, provide valued input into discussions and keep us all focusing on the prize of a more receptive art environment.

The calendar of events in 2024-2025 has been superb and allowed groups to engage with a wide audience and hopefully sell their beautiful artisan goods. The revamp of the Open Day was particularly effective and drew a wide group of participants. It was a joy to see so many engaged in learning and teaching their chosen craft. Thank you to all who helped in the preparation, running and clean-up after the events. These things don't happen magically, and the more hands involved the lighter the load.

In 2024-2025 we focused on helping members to upskill in the area of social media by offering free workshops, and this is the biggest success story for the year. Understanding of the social media platforms, using those platforms, and how to drive our message into the market has been implemented with much enthusiasm. The message that BVAC is a vibrant community of artisans from many different spheres is getting out to the wider public.

In closing I would like to thank BVAC for the honour of being your President for the last two years and look forward to following your adventures and achievements moving forward. I really feel that the current committee has made huge strides in making BVAC a welcoming and innovative space. Thank you.



## **Notes from BVAC AGM, 27th March 2025** (continued)

### **BVAC TREASURER'S REPORT**

A savings account was set up in May 2024 to increase our interest windfall. We also have a working account and a separate Pop Up Shop Account. Additionally, we set up a Bendigo Bank 12-month term deposit (4.75%PA) with interest payable on review (29 March 2025). A substantial increase in interest paid is anticipated.

**Income**: Income was stable during 2024 with a small increase compared to 2023. No grant money was received in 2024.

**Expenses:** BVAC recorded a loss in 2024.

Operating expenses increased 63% from 2023 to 2024. Reasons for this were expenditure on repairs to the BVAC building and repairs to the lift with a necessary upgrade to the lift telephone. There was a significant increase in the cost of cleaning for the BVAC building. BVAC also made a strategic investment during 2024 on advertising and marketing, with the engagement of a professional marketing expert for 6 months who worked with the BVAC committee members and BVAC member groups.

**Proposal to increase fees:** The fee structure for BVAC has not changed since 2012. The cost of maintaining the BVAC building is increasing significantly. Also, investing in professional marketing, has had many benefits. To maintain our agenda, we must consider increasing fees.

Given the varied nature and interests of the groups that make up BVAC, it would be fairest to spread the cost by making small increases to all types of fees and to phase the increases in starting in July this year.

**Membership:** From 2026, membership will increase from \$100/year to \$120/year per group.

**Storage:** From 2026, increase from \$5 per sq metre x 12 months (charged annually) to \$7 per sq metre x 12 months (charged annually).

**Pop up Shop:** From 2025 increase table/space hire from \$60 to \$70/table. No increase in shelf hire.

**BVAC Hall rental:** From July 2025 increase all fees by \$10. Three groups accounted for 82% of hall rental income in 2024: Lilly Lee (56%), QBG (13%) and WSQ (13%). Only 2 non-BVAC members hired the hall in 2024.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** There haven't been a lot of changes in the last 12 months as we finalized many projects. Two Pop Up Shops were held. Both were successful in raising awareness of BVAC and our member groups. We held our Open Weekend where we introduced a central booking system for the workshops using Eventbrite. This helped to increase the number of classes and the number of bookings for the event.

Two Professional Development sessions were held this year. Both were for using Facebook and Instagram to promote your group, and advertise group and BVAC events. Both were run by Thea Parry. Thea also did the publicity for the Pop-Ups and Open Weekend. Audiences for both events increased. We have a new and exciting BVAC website.

We have started looking at plans for expanding the Hub premises. This will be good for all groups in the future. In closing, the President and Treasurer have been both awesome and very efficient when I needed them, In fact the whole committee has been a dream to work with.

### **BUILDING AND MAINTENANCE REPORT:**

The lift has had a few problems this year. It has been working well since the phone SIM was replaced. There is regular lift maintenance (and 1-2 weekly jamb cleaning) providing consistent functionality.

Doors: Door jamb replaced on downstairs single Fire Exit Door jamb. Upstairs East double doors repaired. QBG door handles X 2 repaired.



### **BUILDING AND MAINTENANCE REPORT (cont'd):**

Roof has been cleaned. A gutter clean is done 6-9mthly.

Emergency Access - Meetings in 2024 & 2025 with BCC and Emergency access teams to assess and improve emergency access.

Fire Compliance: Extinguisher checks up to date. New Fire forms for Hirer's have been prepared, Smoke alarms installed.

Electrical: Up to date. Yearly tag and testing and quarterly safety checks completed, BCC electrical compliance. Outdoor PowerPoints installed.

Trees: We are surrounded by gum trees. An application for tree lopping has been filed.

Pest Control: Annual pest Inspection and treatment completed. No concerns to the building noted. Airconditioning: Repairs and maintenance – all functioning.

Miscellaneous: New Hand towel dispensers installed lower floor. Door hooks on lower floor doors. Maintenance still in process. Sign to deter school parking.

**BVAC WEBSITE REPORT 2024:** 2024 was a full year for restructuring of the BVAC website. With the engagement of Thea Parry assisting BVAC with our digital marketing we also embarked on upgrading our website from Word Press to a more hands on Wix platform. Thea was instrumental in migrating all the information across and has done a terrific job.

The BVAC website is now very easy to navigate around with a clear understanding of who we are and what we provide and welcoming new members; and how to apply for membership.

The home page clearly states we offer workshops/art spaces and markets with the tag CREATE CONNECT LEARN which sums up our organisation well. The MEMBERSHIP drop down bar has BECOME A MEMBER / OUR MEMBER GROUPS and a secure link to our monthly newsletter. We now have a form for potential new member groups to enquire and submit their questions and wishes to join us at BVAC.

The next drop down is to our NEWS which includes the latest weekend highlights and Popup shops. This will be updated as required. The WHATS ON drop down has the all important calendar for BVAC members, and any MEMBER EVENTS which offer an extra form of publicity for our members.

Our new website has set us up to be a stronger and more inclusive art group, engaging with the public and inviting new members to be included.

**Exhibition Officer Report:** Three events were run this year. The two Pop-Up Shops were both quite successful. Customers enjoyed the find an "object" sideline and had a lot of fun as they searched out the different items at each event. Thanks to Pauline for the idea and Joanna Faber for running with it.

The Open Weekend ran in a new format, and was also a huge success. Bookings are now being made through Eventbrite. The focus of the weekend was brought back to learning about what our groups offer through demonstrations rather than focusing on selling. Being able to learn about so many crafts in one place is a plus, and produced a much busier event. Many thanks to Perrin and Lilly Lee students and teachers for all the wonderful food at the weekend and all the tutors and set-up and cleaning crew for making everything run so smoothly.


